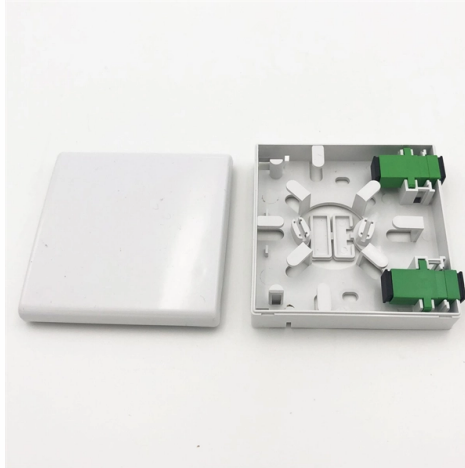

Perforated trays: Moderate depth to balance containment and ventilation. Channel or wire mesh trays: Shallower, suitable for light-duty or flexible installations. Increasing tray depth does not always increase usable capacity efficiently; often, increasing width provides better airflow and easier cable pulling than simply choosing a deeper tray. NEMA VE standards provide guidance on metal cable tray design, including side rail height, to ensure structural integrity and electrical continuity.
