- OM5 (50/125 μm , SWDM capable): Lime green jackets, supporting multiple wavelengths for 100+ Gb/s transmission.

Additional Notes:

- Outdoor cables:** Often have black jackets to resist UV exposure, with printed markings indicating fiber type and specifications.
- Hybrid or multi-type cables:** May use custom colors or printed legends to identify fiber types inside the cable.
- High-fiber-count cables:** Individual fibers inside multi-fiber cables follow a 12-color sequence for identification, but the outer jacket color still indicates the overall fiber type.

Using these standardized colors ensures rapid identification, reduces installation errors, and maintains consistency across global networks. Technicians can quickly distinguish fiber types during installation, maintenance, or troubleshooting, which is especially important in high-density or data center environments.
