- Lime connectors: OM5 multimode fiber, designed for wideband applications.

Fiber Color Sequence Inside Cables For individual fibers within a cable, the TIA/EIA-598-C standard defines a 12-color sequence for identification: Blue, Orange, Green, Brown, Slate, White, Red, Black, Yellow, Violet, Rose, Aqua. For cables with more than 12 fibers, the sequence repeats with stripes or markers to distinguish groups. In high-density MPO connectors (16 fibers), additional colors are used: 13: Olive, 14: Magenta, 15: Tan, 16: Lime.

Practical Guidelines Always match connector colors when mating: green to green (APC), blue to blue (UPC). Never mix APC and UPC. Jacket colors also indicate fiber type: yellow for single-mode, orange for OM1/OM2, aqua for OM3/OM4, violet for high-performance OM4, lime for OM5. Connector boots and adapters follow the same color scheme to maintain consistency.
