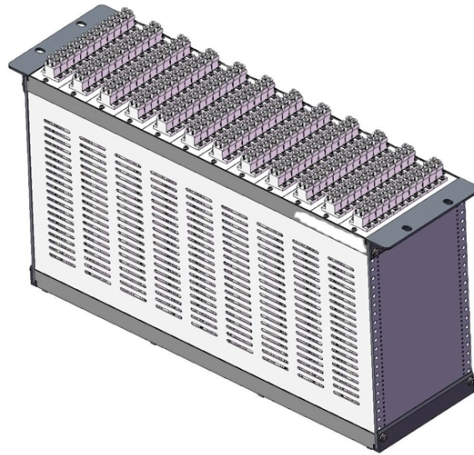


Connecting to an Ethernet switch

Access the switch via a web browser using its IP address (provided in the manual). Configure VLANs, QoS, or security settings to optimize network performance. Update firmware periodically to maintain security and functionality.
- 6. Verify Connectivity**

Check that all devices connected to the switch can communicate with each other and access the internet if connected through the router. Troubleshoot by checking cables, LED indicators, and restarting the switch or devices if needed.

- For large networks, consider a managed switch for advanced configuration and traffic management.
