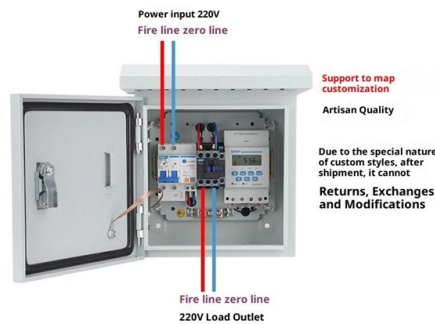


DIY Fireproof Sealing for Cable Trays

Layer Fire Blocking Materials: Place firestop packs, mineral wool, or fireproof boards layer by layer, ensuring compact and uniform coverage.

Fill Gaps with Fireproof Mortar: Apply mortar between cables, trays, and fire blocking materials. Ensure the surface is smooth and tight, with no visible cracks.

Apply Fireproof Coating: For metal trays, apply a primer followed by a fireproof topcoat evenly using a brush, roller, or spray. Control thickness according to design specifications.

Secure Protective Plates: Fix steel plates securely over the sealed area, ensuring they are treated with fireproof paint and properly aligned.

Maintain Adequate Clearance: Ensure cables are spaced to allow heat dissipation and prevent overheating.

Check for Cracks or Voids: Sealing must be tight and reliable, with no gaps larger than 1 cm².

Routine Inspection: Regularly inspect trays for corrosion, coating degradation, or mechanical damage, and reapply fireproofing as needed.
