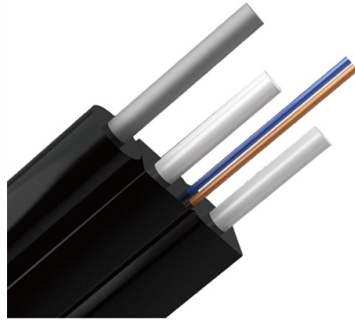


Electroplating process for galvanized cable trays



Overview

Zinc rich coating is a common process used for this type of part, and requires only a temperature of 280°C (536°F) or less, either by centrifuging or spraying.
