- SC-to-FC Adapters:** These adapters allow two separate fiber cables—one SC and one FC—to be joined. They are commonly used in ODF panels, telecom racks, and lab setups.

Considerations

- Polish Type:** Ensure the connectors match in polish style (PC, UPC, or APC) to minimize insertion loss and back-reflection. For example, SC/UPC should connect to FC/UPC, and SC/APC to FC/APC.
- Fiber Type:** Single-mode or multimode fibers must match across the connection.
- Insertion Loss:** SC-to-FC connections typically have low insertion loss (~ 0.2 – 0.5 dB) if properly aligned and clean.
- Handling:** FC connectors require careful screwing to avoid damaging the ferrule, while SC connectors use a simple push-pull mechanism.
