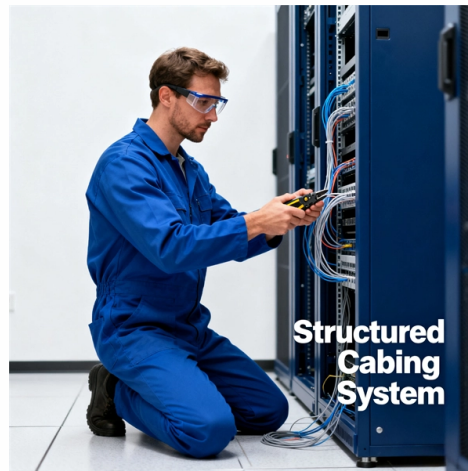


# How to connect the fiber optic connector

  - FC connector: threaded screw mechanism .Crimp or tighten the ferrule as required to stabilize the fiber .
4. Polish and CleanPolish the fiber end face to ensure smooth light transmission .Clean the end face with alcohol and fiber cleaning rods to remove dust or debris .
5. Test the ConnectionUse an optical power meter or Optical Time Domain Reflectometer (OTDR) to verify signal strength and detect any faults .
6. Cable ManagementSecure excess cable with velcro straps or cable managers to prevent bending beyond the minimum radius .Ensure connectors are properly aligned and locked to maintain a stable connection .
