

How to remove the multimode fiber optic module

To safely remove a multimode fiber optic module, unplug the fiber cable, unlock the module's pull-tab or latch, and gently pull it out horizontally, then cover the port with a dust cap. Step-by-Step Removal Process

Power Down or Disable the Port (Optional but Recommended) If your device allows, gracefully shut down the interface via the management interface (CLI or GUI) to prevent link errors or data loss.

Wear ESD Protection Always wear a grounded ESD wrist strap and work on an ESD-safe mat to prevent electrostatic discharge that could damage the module.

Disconnect the Fiber Cable Grasp the fiber connector by the body (not the cable) and gently unplug it from the module. Avoid pulling on the fiber itself to prevent breakage.

Unlock the Module Identify the pull-tab or latch on the SFP module. Flip or pull the tab to release the module from the host port. Do not force the module out without unlocking, as this can damage the internal locking spring.

Remove the Module Pull the module straight out horizontally from the port. Avoid tilting or twisting, which could damage the module or the port.

Protect the Module and Port Immediately place a dust cap on the unused module and on the host port to prevent contamination of the optical path.

Handle with Care Hold the module by its sides or metal cage. Avoid touching the optical bore or connector end-faces. Clean fiber connectors with approved lint-free wipes and isopropyl alcohol if needed before reinsertion.

Additional Tips Do not look directly into active fiber ports, even if they are low-power Class 1 lasers, to avoid eye exposure.

Store removed modules in anti-static bags or protective cases to prevent dust and ESD damage.

Inspect the port and module for debris or damage before reinserting or replacing the module. Following these steps ensures safe removal of multimode fiber optic modules while maintaining port integrity and module longevity.
