

How to tell if a fiber optic cable in a switch is good or bad

For shorter or visible fiber runs, a Visual Fault Locator (VFL) can help identify breaks or misaligned connections.

Transceiver and Port Verification Swap the transceivers with known-good units to determine if the issue is with the switch or the module itself. Ensure the transceivers are compatible with the switch and the fiber type (single-mode or multi-mode) to avoid unpredictable behavior. Check for port errors or abnormal throughput using the switch's management interface (CLI, SNMP, or web GUI).

Advanced Troubleshooting If problems persist, use an OTDR to locate hidden faults, microbends, or breaks along the fiber. Compare the measured loss against the specifications for the switch and fiber type. Loss across all fibers may indicate a cable or switch issue, while loss on a single fiber may point to a bad connector or splice. Also, verify that the switch firmware is up t...
