

How to use cable tray partitions

Step 5: Place the Tray Sections Lift and align tray sections onto the supports. Secure each section with bolts or hold-down clips. Use couplers to join sections end-to-end, ensuring a continuous, stable path for cables.

Step 6: Install the Partitions Measure and cut partitions to fit the tray width and height. Deburr edges to prevent cable damage. Insert partitions at designated locations to separate cable types.
