

Manual stripping of fiber optic patch cords

Step 3: Strip the Buffer and Primary Coating Use a fiber-specific stripper to remove the buffer layer and primary coating (typically 250 μm acrylic) without nicking the glass fiber (). For single-fiber cables, hand tools, heated strippers, or automated stripping tools can be used. Ensure the blade is sharp and the cut edge is straight and clean (). Avoid attempting to separate the cladding from the core; these are inseparable components ().

Step 4: Clean the Fiber End Use single-fiber or multi-fiber cleaning tools to remove dust and debris from the fiber end face (). Dry cleaning tools with a push-and-click mechanism are preferred to avoid solvents and prevent contamination (). Ensure the fiber end is free of gel, adhesive, or dust before connectorization ().

Best Practices Always strip each layer individually; do not attempt to remove multiple layers at once (). Maintain sharp, well-calibrated tools to prevent jagged cuts or scratches. Handle fibers gently and avoid bending them shar...
