Connection Components SFP/SFP+ Modules: OLT ports often use Small Form-factor Pluggable (SFP) transceivers to interface with optical cables. These modules convert electrical signals to optical signals and vice versa, with specific Tx (transmit) and Rx (receive) wavelengths (). Optical Splitters: Downstream from the OLT, optical splitters divide the signal to serve multiple ONTs/ONUs, allowing a single fiber from the OLT to connect to multiple subscribers (). Deployment Considerations Port Capacity: Each OLT port can support a PON network with split ratios typically ranging from 1:32 to 1:128, depending on the PON standard ().
