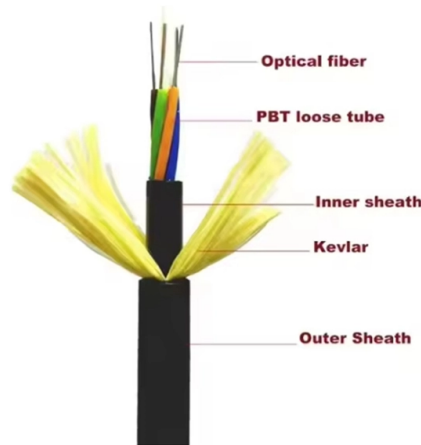


Red-Green Optical Cable Color Sequence

The TIA-598 standard defines a specific 12-color sequence for identifying individual strands. How it scales: For cables with more than 12 fibers (e., 24, 48, 144), the sequence repeats. * For cables >12 fibers: The sequence repeats with one or more black stripes (except black fibers, which receive yellow stripes) to. For optical fiber cables, each individual fiber is color-coded in a specific sequence to facilitate easy identification.
