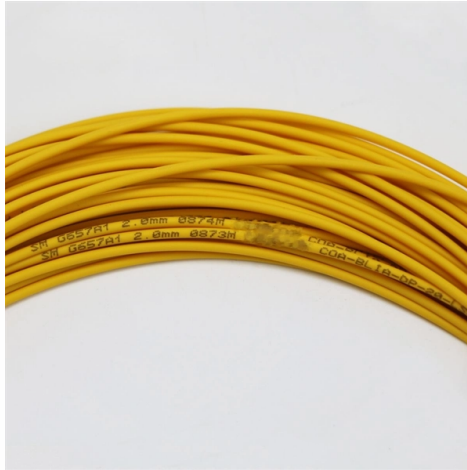

As with any electrical equipment, cable trays and the wiring contained in the trays must be listed, labeled or otherwise approved, pursuant to the requirements of 29 CFR § 1910.303(a).
