Securing the Cable: Fiber optic cables should be fastened at regular intervals to prevent sagging or contact with sharp edges. For vertical runs, secure cables every 0.8–1 meter, and for horizontal runs, every 1 meter. Only use clamps with appropriate diameters to avoid crushing the cable ().

Handling and Pulling: Avoid twisting or exceeding the maximum pulling force of the cable. Use pulling socks or hoisting grips when lifting cables onto the roof, and unwind cables from a drum to prevent kinks or torsion ().

Aerial Mounting: If the cable is mounted on poles or building edges, ensure it does not touch metal structures directly. Use torsion-compensating elements and follow proper aerial installation guidelines, including route surveys, permits, and slack management ().

Maintenance and Repairs: Roof-mounted fiber optic cables require periodic inspection for damage or wear. Repairs should be performed with precision tools to maintain stable connections and prevent signal loss ().

Separation from Power Lines: Maintain proper separation between fiber optic and electrical cables to prevent interference and ensure safety ().

Best Practices Begin installation from the top of the run to simplify pulling and reduce stress on the cable. Use flexible conduits or inner ducts at transit...
