- Clean the fiber:** Wipe the exposed fiber with a lint-free cloth and high-purity alcohol to remove any residue, ensuring optimal splicing or connectorization.
- Cleaving (optional):** For splicing, the fiber end may need a precise cleave to create a smooth end-face for fusion splicing.
