A rung spacing of 6 to 9 inches (150 to 230 mm) is preferable when the cable tray is intended for instrumentation and control applications that require. Cable tray layout and section design forms a vital component of detailed engineering in electric and power systems. The system allows the use of electrical resources in electrical installations and/ or in communication systems.
