Special Cases Some modern routers have SFP (Small Form-factor Pluggable) ports or are labeled as "fiber-ready," allowing direct fiber connections without a separate ONT. However, these are less common in typical home setups, and most users will still rely on an ONT.

Recommendations Ensure your router supports gigabit speeds or higher to fully utilize fiber internet. Use high-quality Ethernet cables to maintain optimal performance. Place the ONT and router in a dry, ventilated area near power outlets. Verify that your ISP has activated the fiber service before troubleshooting connectivity issues.
