Repair or Replacement If scratches are deep or located on critical areas, cleaning alone is insufficient: Repolishing the connector end-face may restore performance if the scratch is repairable. Replacing the connector or cable is recommended for severe scratches, cracks, or pits that cannot be polished out. After repair or replacement, re-inspect the fiber to confirm compliance with IEC standards. Preventive Measures Maintain a stable polishing process with proper lapping films, pressure, and rotation speed to minimize scratches during assembly. Clean all polishing films, connectors, and fixtures thoroughly between steps to avoid cross-contamination. Handle fiber cables carefully, avoiding sharp bends, kinks, or contact with hard surfaces that can cause scratches.
